"A wharfinger is an old-fashioned term for someone who owns or manages a wharf, or dock, and is responsible for the goods delivered there

Responsibilities:

Wharfingers are responsible for the day-to-day activities at the wharf, such as keeping tide tables, resolving disputes, and managing slipways. They also receive goods and merchandise that are to be delivered to a consignee.

Office:

Wharfingers usually have an office on the wharf or dock.

Dock warrant:

Wharfingers may issue a dock warrant, which is a certificate that they hold goods.

Modern term:

Modern term:
The term "wharfinger" is rarely used today, and is usually replaced by the term "harbourmaster".

The earliest known use of the term "wharfinger" was in the mid-1500s.

First one is this page found at the end of a 1911 piece in the Welsh county of Caernafornshire.



My first thought is that someone had made a mistake, these scans were for a Welsh piece and as such, a page from the Scottish 1911 census should not be there. However the enumerator's summary of the piece (seen below) confirms that this page should be there.

The more plausible explanation is that the census papers for this vessel were delivered by one enumerator while the ship was in dock at some undisclosed location in Scotland, and collected by another enumerator while the vessel was docked at the wharf in Tan Y Graig, Wales.

And while working on an 1861 piece in Nottingham, I came across a few pages that initially looked like they were accidentally scanned as part of the piece.



However the three pages do have folio, and page numbers which indicate that they are indeed part of the enumerator's book for the piece. Most likely explanation is that the mentioned organisation did some research for somebody with results inserted into the enumerator's book for all to see, and included when they were scanned.

For the other two pages, one is a tree of the Powell family most likely supplied from the customer to the research company, and the third page names which Nottingham 1861 pieces were searched to locate this family, and that the search was unsuccessful.

Important Notes:

- If the piece number has a letter after it, then this suggests that the upload only contains particular districts within the piece, not all districts that make up the piece
- If a place name is followed by a county code, then this indicates that this place is actually in that county, not the county the piece is listed under

FreeCEN1

The last reported updated to our old website at https://freecen1.freecen.org.uk/ took place on July 6th 2021. Further updates to this website have, as of now been discontinued, and as of now, any new uploads of completed pieces will take place on FreeCEN2 only.
